***ADHD on Trial: Courtroom Clashes over the Meaning of Disability*  
Feb 22 2023 In 2006 Philadelphia, graduate student Jonathan Love  
sued the organization that publishes the Law School Admissions  
Test. Love had attained average scores on the test, but claimed he  
should have been given extra time because he qualified as a person  
with a disability - and allowances provided by the Americans with  
Disabilities Act - due to Attention Deficit Hyperactivity Disorder.  
The case, which drew in author psychologist Michael Gordon as an  
expert witness for the defense, reached federal court and resulted  
in a precedent-setting ruling still as controversial as the disorder  
that triggered the trial. In this work, Gordon takes us into the**

courtroom and behind the scenes with attorneys and experts to look not only at this trial, but more than a dozen others that have involved ADHD or other psychiatric diagnoses, and the questions they raise, including what the real meaning of disability is, how malingering can be an issue with psychological disorders, and what the more far-reaching effects for the public can be if accommodations are provided to people who do not have a legally-defined disability. When does deference to an individual with a disorder like ADHD begin to invade the rights of the non-disabled? Controversy fills these pages, from discussion of ADHD and the debate over its justifiability as a disability to public reactions regarding the ruling in Love's case and others. Comparisons and contrasts are also raised between the Love trial and earlier cases involving people claiming psychological disabilities who fought actions by The National Board of Medical Examiners, United Airlines, Toyota Motor Manufacturing, the Georgia State Board of Veterinary Medicine, and other organizations. Do the decisions help or harm disability rights and people with disabilities? Gordon offers the insights not only of a psychologist, but a seasoned legal insider who has testified as an expert witness at many of the trials.

Managing Culture Clashes in M&A's Nov 19 2022 Merger and acquisition activities have become an integral part of today's business world. Most people will never know what it is like to live on an Indian reservation in North America, or what it means to identify as an American Indian. However, when conflicts embroil Indigenous folk, as shown by the protests over a crude oil pipeline in 2016 and 2017, camera crews and reporters descend on “the rez” to cover the event. The book offers insight into how the history of Indian-settler relations sets the stage for modern clashes, and examines American Indian knowledge systems, and how they take a back seat to mainstream approaches to science in discourse.

**The First Modern Clash over Federal Power Dec 20 2022** Fully examined for the first time in this engrossing book by one of America's preeminent presidential scholars, the election that pitted Woodrow Wilson against Charles Evan Hughes emerges as a clear template for the partisan differences of the modern era. The 1916 election dramatically enacted the two parties' fast-evolving philosophies about the role and reach of federal power. Lewis Gould reveals how, even more than in the celebrated election of 1912, the parties divided along class-based lines in 1916, with the Wilson campaign in many respects anticipating the New Deal while the Republicans adopted the small government, anti-union, and anti-regulation positions they have embraced ever since. The Republicans dismissed Wilson's 1912 win as a fluke, the result of Theodore Roosevelt's “Progressive” apostasy splitting the party. But in US Supreme Court Justice Hughes, whose electoral prowess had been proven in two successful runs for governor of New York, the Republicans had anointed a flawed campaigner whose missteps in California sealed his fate very late in the election. Wilson's strong performance as the head of a united Democratic government (for the first time since 1894), along with Americans' uncertainty about the outbreak of war in Europe, led to victory. Along with the ins and outs of the race itself, Gould's book explores the election's broader meaning—as, for the first time, the popular election of the Senate coincided with a presidential election, and the women's suffrage



movement gathered steam. The year 1916 also marked the restoration of a two-party competition for president and, as we see in this enlightening book, the beginning of the two-party battle for the hearts and minds of Americans that continues to this day.

**BUCKLEY, BATMAN & MYNDIE: Echoes of the Victorian culture-clash frontier** Jun 14 2022 Sounding 7 begins with Echo 107 titled **CONTEMPORARY EUROPEAN EYES ON THE OZ CULTURE-CLASH FRONTIER** followed by echoes on **BUCKLEY REVISITED, AFTER THE PROTECTORATE CRUMBLLED** and **WHAT OF PROTECTOR ROBINSON?** Echoes follow on salvaging tribal ways, the Merri Creek black orphanage, 'going round the bend' at the Asylum and Echo 114: **THE CELESTIALS OF VICTORIA**, being the resented Chinese gold miners. Exploring the contrasting fate of Batman, La Trobe and Derrimut, leads into echoes on fringe-dwelling, cultural resistance and Oz racism, in particular the mass psychology of racist ideology that culminated with World War 2. After the gold rush era, life and right behaviour at the Healesville Coranderrk mission station and re-thinking William Thomas the Aboriginal Guardian lead to the pleasant notion of civilizing British colonies through sport. The life and exploits of Tom Wills is celebrated in Echo 122: **THE MAKING & BREAKING OF VICTORIA'S FIRST SPORTING HERO**. Turning to political history, Oz class struggles - convicts, capitalism and nation-building asks the question with Echo 124: **WHITHER MARXISM [?]** and then **BRITISH EMPIRE POLICY REFORMS IN THE 1840s** to contain a Chartist-led revolution. Facets of Victorian 'quality of life' since the land grab are followed by echoes on the astrology of the 1802 Port Phillip Crown possession claim and an echo titled **TOWARDS AN ASTROLOGY OF CIVILIZATION**. The Sounding concludes with approaches to researching Aboriginal society, an undergraduate essay on the Dreamtime and finally with Echo 130: **A RAINBOW SERPENT BRIDGE**. Today in the 21st century, I wonder how differently Oz would have developed if the then ruling British

government in Sydney and London had not used censorship to delay the gold rush for almost 40 years! Sounding 8 begins with Echo 131: **HISTORY DISTORTION & CENSORSHIP** and is backed up with a critique of Britannia's pirate empire that together spawn two more echoes of doubtful but controversial polemics in 1421 - **THE YEAR CHINA DISCOVERED THE WORLD** suggesting they were here in Oz many centuries before Captain Cook. Going even further out on a limb, the focus shifts to recent light shed on 'dark ages barbarians' now considered by some historians to have been more culturally refined than the modern city individual. Back in Oz with Echo 137: **WHITE MAN'S LAW - BLACKFELLOW LAW** and Echo 138: **McLEOD'S BUCKET FROM SKULL CREEK** brings Western Australia after WW2 into wider awareness with the Pilbara pastoral workers strike of 1946-49 that won half-decent wage rights for Aboriginal stockmen. Moving further north, Echo 141: **RECENT ARNHEMLAND CONNECTIONS Part 1: Taming the NT is the stuff of White Australia's race-based patriotism as depicted in Ion Idriess's once-mainstream fascist fictions counterpointed by Part 2: James Gaykamangus's Striving to bridge the chasm: my cultural learning journey.** The final echo 142 talks treaty.
